North America Clan Cameron History

The Clan Cameron Association was formed in 1889 in Scotland as a means to perpetuate the clan's history. The worldwide network is accountable to Donald Cameron of Lochiel. The Cameron Clan in North America is the collective name used to encompass all the Cameron clansfolk spread among the various regions, branches and chapters.

The commissioner and the presidents of each of the six regions represent Lochiel and are appointed by him.

Each region contains branches that are approved by Lochiel and are supervised by the appointed presidents. Officers for each branch are typically elected by branch members. Branches function independently within this system and are non-political in nature.

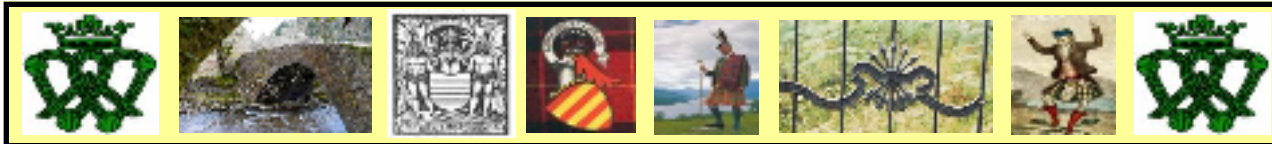
